#### **Launch out into the Deep – March 2024**

It is usually around Lent when I pull out my CDs for Richard Foster's classic devotional work, "A Celebration of Discipline: The Path to Spiritual Growth." While I have the book in hard copy and on my Kindle, I like to listen to the CDs as the book is read by the author. Foster has such a pleasant voice and his inflection really brings to life the content of his work.

Foster's observations and commentary on the spiritual problems in today's society are striking. While it is a fairly short work, only 224 pages, it is packed full of wisdom on how to live a fuller and more meaningful life. I just like the way the gentleman talks and writes. Foster has a way of making keen and critical observations without demeaning the subject at hand. I often quote from his work in my sermons.

Foster begins his first chapter titled 'The Spiritual Disciplines: Door to Liberation' with these words:

Superficiality is the curse of our age. The doctrine of instant satisfaction is a primary spiritual problem. The desperate need today is not for a greater number of intelligent people, or gifted people, but for deep people. The classical disciplines of the spiritual life call us to move beyond surface living into the depths. They invite us to explore the inner caverns of the spiritual.

Foster continues further in the chapter:

Psalm 42:7 reads "Deep calls to deep." Perhaps somewhere in the subterranean chambers of your life you have heard the call to deeper, fuller living. You have become weary of frothy experiences and shallow teaching. Every now and then you have caught glimpses, hints of something more than you have known. Inwardly you long to launch out into the deep.

From there, chapter by chapter, Foster offers practical instructions on how to practice such disciplines as meditation, prayer, fasting, study, and simplicity. True to good Lutheran theology, Foster notes that the spiritual disciplines are not a means by which we receive the righteousness of God, for righteousness is a free gift we receive through the grace of Jesus Christ. Rather, the disciplines put us in a place where God can bless us. They are a means of grace.

I understand the disciplines as much needed medicine for people who are weary of a busy and demanding world. If we truly believe that God cares for us and wants the best for us, why would we not go to him for healing and guidance? Jesus promises to be the very living water for our souls which are thirsty and stained in a world dominated by self interest and fear.

I never tire of speaking and preaching about it. Any who is interested, Foster's work can be easily obtained through Amazon. I truly believe they are worth our most sincere effort. I hope you don't tire of hearing and thinking about the spiritual life available to all Christians.





### Music Notes



#### Christ Arose!



### Christ Arose! 1874

What can exhausted pastors do to relax on Sunday nights after a hard day's work? Baptist preacher Robert Lowry went home to his wife and three sons---and wrote hymns. "Dr. Lowry will continue to preach the gospel in his hymns long after his sermons have been forgotten," Ira Sankey once wrote. "Many of his hymns were written after the Sunday evening service, when his body was weary, but his mind refused to rest."

Robert Lowry was born in Pennsylvania in 1826. At his conversion at the age of seventeen, he joined a Baptist church. Shortly afterward, he enrolled at the University of Lewisburg (now Bucknell University in Lewisburg, Pennsylvania). After graduating he pastored churches in New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. He also taught at Bucknell and at one time served as its chancellor. Lowry gained a reputation for keen biblical scholarship and powerful preaching.

When gospel song editor William Bradley Died in 1868, Lowry was chosen to replace him as a publisher of Sunday school music. He's best known, however, for his own gospel songs, including:

"Nothing But the Blood" (words & music)

"Shall We Gather at the River?" (words & music)

"Where Is My Wandering Boy Tonight?" (words & music)

"All the Way My Savior Leads Me" (music)

I Need Thee Every Hour" (music)

"Marching to Zion" (music)

"Music, with me has been a side issue," he once said. "I would rather preach a gospel sermon to an appreciative audience than write a hymn. I have always looked upon myself as a preacher and felt a sort of depreciation when I began to be known more as a composer."

This hymn, "Christ Arose!" was written one evening during the Easter season of 1874 while Lowry was engaged in his devotions. He became deeply impressed with Luke 24:6-8, especially the words of the angel at the tomb of Christ: "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but risen!"

The words and music began forming together in his mind. Going to the little pump organ in his home, Lowry soon completed what was to become one of our greatest resurrection hymns.

## Chefs Corner

#### Orange Julius

1(6oz.) can froze orange juice1 cup water½ cup sugar1 tsp vanilla2 trays ice cubes1 cup milk

In an electric blender put orange juice, milk, sugar, water, and vanilla. Add approximately 8 ice cubes at a time. Continue blending and adding ice cubes until desired consistency.



#### Brown Mountain Cake

1 cup softened butter 2 Tbsp. cocoa

2 cup sugar 1 cup buttermilk or sour cream

3 eggs 3 cups sifted flour 1 tsp vanilla 1 tsp baking soda ½ tsp salt ½ cup water

Cream butter and sugar. Beat in eggs, 21 at a time. Sift dry ingredients together. Add alternately with butter milk or sour cream to a creamed mixture. Stir in vanilla and warm water. Bake in a lightly greased and floured 9x13 inch pan at 350\* for about 45 minutes.

#### Crazy Chicken Casserole

3 cups cooked diced chicken 14 oz. Chow Mein noodles

2 cans cream of mushroom soup 1 green pepper diced 2 cans cream of chicken soup 2 cups diced celery

2 cans chicken with rice soup \quad \quad \quad \text{cup sherry}

1 can condensed milk 2 can French fried onion rings

1 (4oz.) can mushrooms

Mix all ingredients together well. Pour into 1 greased 9x13 inch baking dish and1-9 inch square baking dish. Bake at 300\* for 1 hour.

#### Broccoli Slaw

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup oil 1 pkg. chicken flavored Roman noodles-uncooked

1/3 cup cider vinegar
1/2 cup sugar
1 cup chopped cashews
1 cup sunflower seeds

1 bag broccoli slaw 1 bunch green onions (chopped)

Dressing- mix together oil, vinegar, sugar together, then stir in the powder mix from the noodles till mixed well. Next break up the noodles and toss with the broccoli and onion. Pour the dressing over top and toss. Add the cashews and sunflowers seeds on top about 1 hour before serving.
